Edenbank Farm fonds. -- ca. 1870 - ca.1987. -- 2.15 m of textual records. -- 676 photographs. -- 18 sketches -- 54 sound recordings. -- 3 maps.

Administrative/Biographical History

Edenbank Farm was the home of five succeeding generations of the Wells family, who were highly acclaimed for their progressive agricultural practices and leadership in Chilliwack's community affairs.

Allen Casey Wells (1837-1922), a harness maker born in Napanee, Ontario, arrived in B.C. to join the Cariboo Gold Rush in 1862. He was later joined by his wife, Sarah Manetta Hodge (1835-1921), whom he had married in 1859.

Wells opened a harness making business in Yale, but moved to Chilliwack in 1866 to manage the large land holdings of his brother-in-law, Charles Evans. In June 1866, he purchased D.L. 38, a 150-acre lot on Coqualeetza Slough (now Luckakuck Creek). The following year, he pre-empted the adjoining D.L. 261, and moved his family to the new farm. In 1877 he added D.L. 279, bringing the size of the farm to over 450 acres.

A.C. and Sarah Wells had two children: Lillie Jane (Mrs. Ernest Townsley, 1865-1919) and Edwin Allen (1870-1942). An adopted daughter, Mildred (Mrs. A.E.J. Farrow) may have been a cousin. The name Eden Bank (or Edenbank) was chosen for the farm by Lillie Wells in the 1880's.

Edenbank prospered as a producer of hay, root crops, and dairy products. In 1885, Wells established the first creamery and cheese factory in the Chilliwack area, in 1891 he built the first upright silo in western Canada, in 1892 he established a herd of Ayrshire cattle which became famous for its quality, and in 1894 a barn with capacity for 100 head of cattle was built.

The farm business by then was styled "A.C. Wells & Son". The Eden Bank Creamery Co. Ltd. became a separate business in 1896 when four neighbors joined in capitalizing it. The Edenbank Trading Co., a general store established by the creamery in 1907, became a separate business in 1912.

A.C. Wells was a lay leader of the Methodist Church in Chilliwack. He also acted as the community's dentist during the pioneer era, served as a Justice of the Peace, and served as Reeve of the Township from 1897 to 1901.

Edwin Wells assumed active management of the farm in 1912. He married Gertrude Eliza Kipp (1871-1918) in 1892. They had seven sons: Ray Edwin (1894-), Allen Victor (1896-1902), Carman Willard (1898-1902), Clarence Casey (1902-1976), Gordon Ernest (1905-1972), Oliver Nelson (1907-1970), and Ronald Gladstone (1911-). In 1920 he married Margaret Smith (d. 1954).

Edwin Wells was an outdoorsman and conservationist whoestablished the Liumchin area as a popular recreational destination; and created the Luckakuck Bird Sanctuary on a portion of Edenbank Farm. He was Reeve of the Township of Chilliwhack in 1931.

In 1939, Edwin's son Oliver Wells became the proprietor of the farm. In 1966 it became a family-owned company, Edenbank Farm Ltd.

Oliver Wells married Sara McKeil (1901-1986) in 1931. They had two daughters, Elizabeth (1933-, Mrs. Robert Purkiss), and Marie (1935-, Mrs. Richard Weeden).

Oliver was an amateur historian and ethnologist. He was President of the Chilliwack Historical Society from 1957 until his death in 1970, and was the author of several articles and pamphlets. He recorded numerous interviews with native elders, and was instrumental in reviving traditional native crafts as an economic enterprise. His death in an automobile accident in Scotland left much of his work unfinished, but in 1987 an anthology of his writings, *The Chilliwacks and their Neighbors* was published, largely through the efforts of Marie Weeden.

Following Oliver's death, Sara Wells lived on the farm with Richard and Marie Weeden and their children, Shelley, Geoffrey, and David. By then, it was almost surrounded by urban development, and was no longer viable as a farm operation. In 1981 it was sold to be developed into residential condominiums.

Custodial History

A small collection of ephemera relating to Edenbank Farm was donated to the Chilliwack Museum by Marie Weeden on January 28, 1981 (accession no. 981.37). Other single items were donated on May 20, 1971 (985.2.2); March 21, 1985 (986.101 and 986.102); October 22, 1985 (986.146); July 5, 1984 (986.224); December 17, 1986 (986.255); and January 23, 1979 (987.106).

The largest portions of the Edenbank Farm fonds, consisting mostly of the farm's business letters and Oliver Wells' papers, book, and photographs, were donated by Mrs. Weeden on December 10, 1987 (987.180) and March 29, 1988 (988.38).

Scope and Content

The fonds consists of a number of different subgroups related to the operation of Edenbank farm, Wells family ethnography interests, and to individual members of the family.

Included is an album of photographs collected by Edwin Wells' second wife Margaret, reflecting her occupation as a missionary teaching at Coqualeetza Institute, as well as her scrapbooks. Edwin Wells and Marie Weeden's scrapbooks and photographs are included as well.

¹Other scattered business letters, personal letters, and genealogical compilations of the Wells family can be found in Add.MSS.1, the Casey Wells papers, particularly files 660-669, 741-821, and 882. Most of the early photographs of the Wells family can be found in P.COLL. 42, the Casey Wells photograph collection. Some of Oliver Wells' ethnological field notes on the Squamish and Nooksack Indians are in Add.MSS. 1, files 670-684.

The fonds also consists of a large aggregation of records pertaining to First Nations people in Chilliwack, including subject files, photographs, sound recordings, transcripts of interviews, drafts of articles, and publications concerning the Stó:lō people. Also included are some business records of his native crafts and publishing ventures, and the drafts and photographs which were published in the final version of *The Chilliwacks and their Neighbors*.
