HARRY J. BARBER

Harry J. Barber was born on March 29, 1875, at Alton, Ontario, where he apprenticed as a pharmacist. In 1898 he arrived in Chilliwack, and established a drugstore in partnership with Dr. J. C. Henderson. He later became sole proprietor of the business. Active in several civic organizations, Barber served as President for the Chilliwack Board of Trade from 1909 to 1913, and Mayor of Chilliwack from 1914 to 1917. From 1925 to 1940 he was Conservative member of parliament for Fraser Valley.

Barber's papers consist mainly of short essays that he wrote in the latter part of his life for compilation as a book, A story of Chilliwack, on the history of Chilliwack. A few other collected essays and clippings are also included.

The papers were acquired by Oliver Wells. They were donated to the Chilliwack Historical Society by Sara E. Wells in 1971.
